The Salvation Army Ottawa Booth Centre

The Salvation Army Ottawa Booth Centre's Community and Family Services responds to the needs of families and singles in the community requiring emergency and follow-up assistance.

Many of our programs and services would not be possible without support from the community.

Emergency Assistance

Using the holistic approach, our case workers and support staff minister to the distressed in the community with assessment of needs, response and follow-up help. This may include links to other sources of assistance, coaching and moral support.

Money Wise Program

Money management program designed for singles and families to gain stability in housing and financial affairs through coaching, trusteeship, and support. The program serves recipients of social benefits, pensions, and/or wages in managing their money in order to reduce the risk of homelessness.



Emergency Groceries and Clothing

In emergency situations, families and singles can access the grocery program located on site at 171 George Street. Families are provided with basic food to cover (2-3 days) immediate emergency needs.

Emergency clothing is available throughout the week. Families and singles are provided with vouchers to use in The Salvation Army Thrift Stores throughout the city.



In both cases, it is necessary to provide a piece of valid identification, proof of address, and proof of income.

Often when the crisis is beyond the need for the basics. Our Case Workers refer clients to other supports in the community such as pastoral counseling, budget coaching, community feeding programs, as well as our various other programs.

LEAP Program

The LEAP program provides financial support and referral to other social service agencies, for individuals and families who are facing disconnection of essential utilities as a result of arrears.

+Christmas Activities



The Community and Family Services oversees the annual operation of the Toy Centre. Parents demonstrating a need for help during the holidays are provided with new toys for their children 12 years of age or under.

Families may also request assistance towards the purchase of Christmas dinner through our Caring and Sharing program.

Summer Fun



For a minimal cost, children ages 7 to 16 can enjoy a full week of camping at our two facilities on Lake Simcoe and Muskoka. Transportation is included.
