- You have access to a large fully functioning kitchen with stove, microwave, fridge, and freezer
- You have access to laundry facilities on the floor
- Lounge with cable TV is open to all residents on the floor

## Incarcerated Clients

Individuals who are facing legal action or incarcerated may apply for the Anchorage program through their legal counsel or direct contact with the Addictions Services team. Admission criteria remains the same as above in that, Stabilization must be completed before graduating to another long term treatment facility.



## What is Stabilization?

Stabilization is a program that helps you prepare for an individualized treatment plan, while you work towards recovery goals. It is located on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor of the Salvation Army Ottawa Booth Centre shelter building, at 171 George St.

While in Stabilization, you will attend daily group programs, and you will meet with your counsellor once a week.

## The Community Reinforcement Approach

The Anchorage program uses the Community Reinforcement Approach (CRA). The CRA approach is based on the idea that people are more likely to be able to maintain the changes they make when they begin to experience the rewards of a recovery lifestyle. This can include:

- Developing positive resources to support your change
- Participating in rewarding social activities
- Strengthening relationships and connection with others
- Discovering your purpose
- Achieving short/long term goals
- Developing spiritual connection.

## Entering Stabilization

Everyone who wants to gain entrance into Stabilization **must first fill out an application**. We are interested in getting to know who you are and how you will benefit from our services!

### Here are the steps for admission into Stabilization:

- **Contact Addictions Services staff for admission information.** Applications can be accessed online at [www.ottawaboothcentre.org](http://www.ottawaboothcentre.org)
- After your application has been reviewed, **we will contact you within a maximum of 14 days to notify you of the results.**
- **MUST BE DRUG AND ALCOHOL FREE FOR 24 HOURS PRIOR TO ENTERING THE PROGRAM**
- You, or your representative (lawyer, probation/parole officer, etc.) will be required to **maintain contact with staff until there is space available for you**
- When a bed is available, staff will contact you or your representative and give you an **intake date**

## Individual Counselling

While in Stabilization, you will meet every week with an addictions counsellor. You and your counsellor will work together to identify issues and work towards recovery goals.

Your time with your counsellor is yours to use however you may choose. You may be interested in talking about any of the following topics:

- Stress
- Anxiety and depression
- Anger management
- Self esteem
- Grief and loss
